Catholic University is located in Northeast Washington, D.C., on a tree-lined 193-acre campus, approximately three miles north of the U.S. Capitol. The intern housing application for Summer 2009 will be posted in early January 2009.

TMH is located on Capitol Hill within walking distance of Congressional offices, many government agencies, the Library of Congress, and the Smithsonian museums. It is also convenient to the bus and Metro lines and Union Station. Residents must agree to abide by house rules, including no alcohol and/or drugs on the premises, no smoking in the building, and no male guests beyond the lobby level.

Rates start: \$855 per month. (Rates are subject to change without notice.) This rate includes utilities, local telephone calling with voice mail, and major meals.
